BATH, OHIO – Folk music will fill the land at Hale Farm & Village on Saturday, July 9th and Sunday, July 10th with the 36th Annual Music in the Valley featuring Folknet acoustic folk musicians. Guests will delight their senses with musical entertainment throughout the scenic grounds at Hale Farm & Village in the heart of the Cuyahoga Valley. Presented in concert with Folknet, this event is also supported by WKSU.

Rather than a central stage, guests will stroll the Hale Farm & Village grounds to discover musical performances under a shade tree, in the apple orchard, upon a picnic table, or beside the blacksmith shop. The musicians create informal jam sessions that entertain the guests throughout the day. With music in the air, the Hale Farm artisans will demonstrate their craft and trade, including blacksmithing, glassblowing, potter, broom making, basket weaving, candle dipping, and more.

Camping is especially convenient for those who come a great distance to perform at the festival. Free camping is available to musicians by reservation.
