THREE CLEVELAND AUTHORS HONOR THE REGION'S HISTORY AT WESTERN RESERVE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

CLEVELAND, OH -- Three Cleveland authors honor the history of the region on Saturday, September 24, 2011 at the Western Reserve Historical Society History Center in University Circle. Part of the popular Arcadia Publishing series, Images of America, the authors of *Cuyahoga County: The First 200 Years*, by Judy Cetina; *Erie Street Cemetery*, by John Cimperman; and *Cleveland's Buckeye Neighborhood* by John Sabol will speak on their respective publications beginning at 2:00pm. A book signing will follow the presentation. The books are available at the History Center Museum Store. The program is free with paid general admission.
