# ABOUT WESTERN RESERVE HISTORICAL SOCIETY



Western Reserve Historical Society (WRHS) is an American history organization, Cleveland's oldest cultural institution and the trusted steward of Northeast Ohio history.

With seven properties, 250 acres, 39 historic structures, and one of the country's finest library and museum collections relating to the American experience, WRHS is among the largest and most diversified historical societies in the United States.

WRHS collects, preserves, studies, documents, and provides access to the stories of Northeast Ohioans – people whose stories are documented and preserved in perpetuity in the artifacts, archives, places and spaces we have been entrusted to steward for nearly 160 years.

WRHS safeguards and shares Northeast Ohio and American history, and provides audiences with a sense of place in a mobile and virtual society.

WRHS is a key resource for state and national history, and especially through library and genealogical collections, WRHS is a resource for anyone studying immigration and migration to the region.

Western Reserve Historical Society (WRHS) is creating a new, permanent gallery that explores the history and culture of immigrants, migrants and newcomers to Northeast Ohio.

This International Heritage Gallery (IHG) will feature a “mosaic” of various ethnic groups over time, their cultures and contributions to regional development, and the unique events that have had particular importance to the development of Northeast Ohio, the United States, and the world.

Opening in 2026, the IHG is a WRHS–America 250 initiative that explores the sweeping story of immigration and migration to Northeast Ohio.

WRHS is a leading repository for materials related to the study of various ethnic groups. Its collections include the African American Archives, Cleveland Jewish Archives, Ethnic Archives, Irish Archives, Italian American Archives, and is the trusted steward of library and museum collections that document the rich heritage of countless other ethnic groups, individuals and organizations.

WRHS collaborates with ethnic groups and organizations on exhibitions, publications and events that celebrate Northeast Ohio's international heritage.

WRHS's core exhibition, Cleveland Starts Here<sup>®</sup>, sponsored by Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Foundation, tells the story of Cleveland and the region. The story continues with Carl & Louis Stokes: Making History, Women & Politics: Empowered to Vote, Empowered to Lead, the African American History Gallery and Chisholm Halle Costume Wing.

The International Heritage Gallery is the natural next step in the transformation of WRHS galleries where the wonderfully diverse history of Northeast Ohio unfolds.

# WRHS INTERNATIONAL HERITAGE GALLERY PROCESS & TIMELINE



WRHS has been working with community leaders for two years to develop a concept and plan for the International Heritage Gallery.

WRHS assembled a working Steering Committee to help guide the process.

The Steering Committee works closely with WRHS staff and other experts to develop a storyline that tells the overall history of immigration and migration, as well as the focused stories of the more than 120 ethnic groups who have settled in Northeast Ohio.

WRHS hosted representatives from Cleveland's ethnic communities for an informational gathering in July 2025 to gauge interest and feedback.

The International Heritage Gallery is scheduled to open in 2026 to mark the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the United States.
