Facility Rental FAQ's In Response to COVID-19

Can I rent the Museum for my private event?

Yes! The Cleveland History Center is following the *Responsible Restart Ohio Restaurants, Bars and Banquets & Catering* guidelines provided by the State of Ohio. This guidance provides best practices to help mitigate exposure to the COVID-19 virus including food safety, cleaning and sanitizing, and social distancing.

How many guests can I invite?

In compliance with the social distancing guidelines, the capacity of each space has been adjusted. Tables are required to be six feet apart and the number of guests at each table will have a maximum of six guests for a standard, round 60" table. Following are the current capacities:

Crawford Rotunda: 100 guests
Hanna Courtyard Garden: 85 guests
Hay Courtyard Garden: 15 guests

Can I have a wedding ceremony in one of the gardens?

Ceremonies are permitted by the State of Ohio. Guests will be directed where to stand to maintain the social distancing guidelines. At this time, chairs will only be available for those who are unable to stand for the duration of the ceremony.

All guests will be required to wear masks. The maximum number of people that can be allowed in the gardens are listed above.

What changes have been made to events due to the COVID-19 guidelines?

- Guests are required to wear masks when not seated at their table.
- There will not be a designated dance floor area. Music (DJ, band) will be permitted.
- Guests will not be permitted to congregate at tables, bar area, or any museum spaces.
- Self-serve food will not be allowed. Your caterer will be required to provide "best practice" guidelines aligned with the Responsible Restart Ohio guidelines.
- Floor plans will be required to be provided to the Cleveland History Center prior to your event.

Can the Carousel be rented for my event?

At this time, the Euclid Beach Park Carousel will not be available to rent for events.

The Cleveland History Center will adjust current policies as directed by the Governor of the State of Ohio and the Cleveland History Center's guidelines.
