**Jonathan Hale and his family settled in the Cuyahoga Valley in 1810** and began a tradition of farming, entrepreneurship, and active community life. In 1956 Clara Belle Richie, the great granddaughter of Jonathan, bequeathed the family farm to the Western Reserve Historical Society, *“to be established as a museum so that the greatest number of persons might learn about the history and culture of the Western Reserve.”*

The museum first opened its doors in 1958, and over the course of the next 60 years the Hale's family farm has transformed into a experiential learning community, a place of beauty with space to learn, reflect and connect.
